1. **Group dances** and **Solo Level 4** should choose music that is meaningful to the group/person and has a positive or Christian message.

- 2. All dances should be no less than two minutes (2:00), and no more than four minutes (4:00).
- 3. Solo Levels 1-3 should perform to the music provided below.
- 4. All song selections and dances should be approved by your corps officer.

Embrace the freedom and get creative!

- Utilize ANY style of music or dance.
- Play to your dancer(s) strengths.
- Utilize the unique culture of your corps participant(s).
- Any language is welcomed (Please provide lyrics in English for the adjudicators).
- Choreodramas are allowed. (A story told through <u>movement</u>).
- Lyrics are not required.

Star Search 2018 Solo Dance Song Selections

Level 1

Song: *Benediction* by Jaye Thomas **Album:** Intimate (Live in the Studio), Track #5, 1:52mins

Style: Male vocalist, slower lyrical feeling

Rational: Song has a clear prayerful message that young dancers can connect with. The length of the song is appropriate for the age of level 1. This song has a very different feel from last year's up beat pop song.

Level 2

Song: *Counted the Cost* by Cory Asbury **Album:** Let Me See Your Eyes, track #5, 3:04mins

Style: Hip hop, up beat, funky

Rational: Different from last years gospel song. This song is a fun upbeat piece for dancers to work with.

Level 3

Song: *We Will Make It There* by Abby Gunderson **Album:** Time Moves Quickly, track #1, 3:08mins

Style: Instrumental, slower tempo

Rational: This song will be a good challenge for level 3. Without lyrics to rely on, dancers should use 2 Corinthians 4:7-16 for movement inspiration.

Level 4

Song: Choose your own music. Appropriate length is between 2:00-4:00minutes.

Style: Your choice!

Rational: Dancers in level 4 are old enough to know what style of movement best suits their body and ability. Choose a piece of music that best displays what you do well that has a positive or Christian message.

Level 1: Benediction
